












### SEEKING EMERGING LEADERS!

### COMPONENTS

1)Weekly Seminar

January - March 2025

The first phase consists of a 2-hour weekly seminar over 11 weeks (Thursdays from 1-3 EST). Course content includes topics such as developing a personal vision, transformational change, and appreciative inquiry.

### 2) Project phase

April - September 2025

The second phase takes place over the next 5-6 months and consists of fellows developing a project idea and being matched with a mentor based on areas of interest. Most mentors have lived and learned expertise.

Upon completion of both phases, fellows will receive a certificate of completion from Yale PRCH.
